- ✓ Each application requires a letter outlining
 - o Your post-secondary plans,
 - o Information and examples about why you would be the most suitable candidate for the specific scholarship, based on the criteria for the scholarship, and
 - o Any other applicable information that would help in the selection process.

Make certain that the letter is specific to the scholarship being applied for, and not just one general letter for all scholarships.

- ✓ Some scholarships require further information; please pay attention to these requirements.
- ✓ Fill out and submit ONE *Personal Data Inventory* sheet that will be kept on file and will be included along with your applications. **Copies of the inventory sheets are available on the DRCSS website under scholarships, and in Guidance.**
- ✓ Attach proof of acceptance into, or confirmation of application to, a program of study (this can be a copy of a letter of acceptance, conditional acceptance, email, etc.) and a transcript with your Personal Data Inventory.
- \checkmark Completed applications should be dropped off in the Guidance office, unless otherwise specified.

Once you have submitted your proof of acceptance, transcript, and Personal Data Inventory documentation for Block 1 Scholarships you do not need to submit additional copies.

Criteria vary for each scholarship. Please review each scholarship description carefully and apply specifically to those that pertain to you.

Photocopy or keep an e-copy of your *Personal Data Inventory* to help you complete your letters for Block 3.

Suggestion: Keep copies of these scholarship letters to help out with scholarship applications after you have completed your first year of post-secondary education. There are many scholarships available throughout your education, so please explore your options!

All students pursuing post-secondary education are encouraged to apply for the scholarships below. Criteria are varied among the scholarships. Please review each scholarship description carefully and apply specifically to those that pertain to you.

The Intermountain Conservation District Scholarship is due to Guidance by May 9, 2019 @ 4:00.

Intermountain Conservation District Scholarship (Amount to be determined)

Awarded to a student who has demonstrated community involvement, academic achievement, is enrolling in environmental science, resource management, agriculture, or other field related to conservation, and is a **resident of the Intermountain Conservation District** (call the IMCD office to verify whether you are a resident of the conservation district - legal land description or street address is required for verification).

The following scholarships require additional information be provided.

Mountain View Teachers' Association Scholarship (\$1000)

Awarded to a student who is graduating from a MVSD high school with the intent of pursuing a Bachelor of Education or Early Childhood Education. The applicant must have made positive contributions to the school and community throughout high school.

To apply for this scholarship, students will submit an application that must include the following:

- ➤ A letter which outlines
 - Volunteer experience at school and in the community,
 - o A brief explanation of why they want to enter the education field,
 - o The name of the post-secondary institution to which they have been accepted (and evidence of this where available), and
 - Other relevant information
- > A reference letter specific to this scholarship
- > A transcript of their academic history

Rotary Club of Dauphin Scholarship (\$3000)

Awarded to students entering a post-secondary trade or apprenticeship program who have an immediate family member that belongs to CUPE Local 3305.

The following scholarships do not require applicants to be registered in a post-secondary program.

Mr. K Citizenship Scholarship (\$500)

Awarded to a graduating student who has demonstrated the qualities of citizenship: respect for self and others, empathy, willingness to help, and contributing to the well being of others.

David Boyd Jr. Memorial Scholarship (\$150)

Awarded to a student who has demonstrated dedication, skill, and high academic achievement in power mechanics.

VTAM (Vocational Teachers' Association of Manitoba) Award of Merit (\$300)

Awarded to an exceptional student who best exemplifies competence, commitment and superior achievement in a light or heavy vocational program of study. Sponsored by Hometown Auto Glass.

The following scholarships require applicants to be registered in a post-secondary program, or preference will be given to applicants registered in a post-secondary program.

Balchen & Kulchycki Surveys Scholarship (\$150)

Awarded to a student pursuing post-secondary studies with preference given to a student with high academic achievement in math and science.

Dauphin Medical Clinic Jan Liebenburg Memorial Scholarship (\$2000)

Awarded to a student of high academic achievement who is entering a Faculty of Science at any university in Canada.

Dauphin Music and Electronics Scholarship (\$125)

Awarded to a student continuing studies in the field of music.

Dauphin Pioneer Association Scholarship (\$200)

Preference is given to a student entering a post-secondary program related to the areas of education or history.

Embroidery By Design and Promotions Scholarship (\$100)

Awarded to a student who has demonstrated dedication, skill, and academic achievement in a vocational program at DRCSS. Preference given to a student registering in post-secondary vocational programming next year.

Intermountain Sport Fish Enhancement Group Scholarship (\$1000)

Awarded to a student who has attained high achievement in biology with preference given to a student entering an area related to conservation or environmental studies.

Kal Tire Scholarship (\$250)

Awarded to a student continuing in power mechanics related studies/training.

Knights of Columbus Council #3497 Scholarship (\$200)

Awarded to a student who has good academic standing as well as community volunteerism.

McDonald's Scholarship (\$100)

Awarded to a deserving student pursuing a post-secondary education.

Mossey River Municipality Scholarship (\$150)

Awarded to a student **from the Municipality of Mossey River** who will be continuing post-secondary studies.

Parkland Source for Sports Scholarship (\$250)

Awarded to a student who has been involved in high school athletics and/or will be continuing studies in the field of athletics.

Parkland Sport and Marine Scholarship (\$100)

Awarded to a deserving student pursuing a post-secondary education.

Reit-Syd Equipment Agriculture Scholarship (\$250)

Awarded to a student continuing post-secondary studies in an agricultural program.

Richard Bogoslowski Memorial Scholarship (\$250)

Awarded to a student who participated on the DRCSS badminton, baseball, slow-pitch or fastball team. The recipient is a student who has displayed good sportsmanship and positive leadership. Preference is given to those applicants who are pursuing athletics or a sports related field in post-secondary studies.

Rocky Mountain Equipment Scholarship (\$250)

First preference will be given to a student entering a trade within the agriculture industry and second preference given to a student entering agricultural science.

Tom Schmidt Memorial Scholarship (\$500)

Awarded to a student attending a post-secondary school, who has had high involvement in DRCSS extra-curricular activities while maintaining a high academic average. The deserving student has displayed leadership throughout the school.
